

The Justice Mapping Center (JMC) works with government agencies and researchers to map and analyze criminal justice and social justice issues throughout the country. We are seeking two GIS interns to work on an exciting nation-wide criminal justice atlas project. The atlas will have two main components: (1) a website with information about the project and an interactive map and data portal, and (2) print publications (reports and briefs) with maps, graphs, data tables, and text.

The selected candidates will have the following responsibilities:

1. Clean and geocode address data
2. Produce maps in ArcGIS using criminal justice data, census data, and other related data sources
3. Produce charts, graphs, and data tables for use in the print publications

This is a 3 month, approximately 20 hour per week paid internship that starts in mid-June and continues to mid-September, with the bulk of the work being in July and August.

Required skills and experience:

- Excellent ArcGIS skills and experience
- Experience geocoding large data sets
- Experience creating charts and graphs to analyze data (using SPSS, Excel, etc.)
- Experience working with and mapping census data
- Solid understanding of relational databases and data manipulation
- Ability to work independently and meet deadlines
- Must be detail oriented
